THE GAP YEAR

While your accommodation may be paid for, transport and other costs may not, so the big problem will be the money you need to make it possible.

Others will see a year out as a chance to work and save money for university. However, you should consider looking for a part-time job because finding full-time work may be difficult now.

Now, is a gap year a good idea? The advantages are that you'll gain independence and will be better prepared for university life. It doesn't matter that you'll be a year older than many of the other undergraduates.
